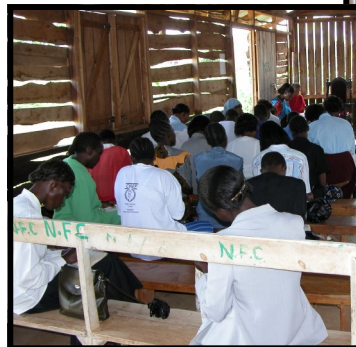

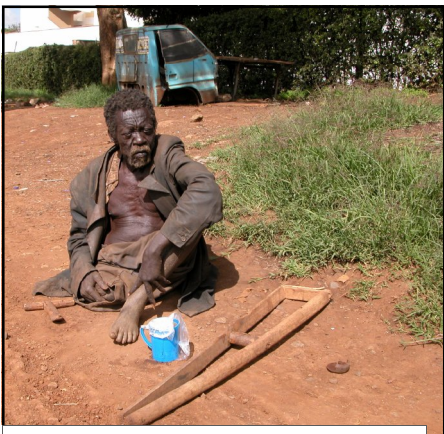


Among topics taught to the ladies were marriage and the Proverbs 31 lady. Pastors and church leaders were taught principles of financial support, marriage, sexuality, parenting, and church leadership. At least 2 professions of faith were made at the ladies' meetings. Hattie and Nadia also brought the gospel to women at a medical clinic, resulting in 25 professions of faith and at least 8 rededications, and they prayed with many. Average attendance: women-63; male leaders-35; youth-36; crusades—approximately 220

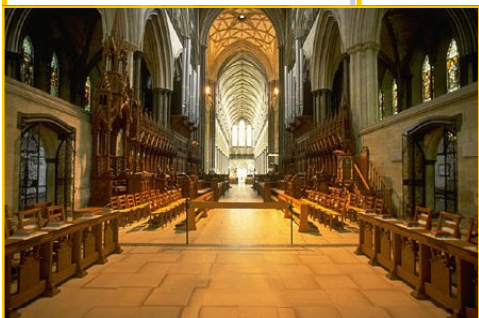
